BANKS COUNTRY STRATEGY





The program is directly related to the third line of action defined in the IDB Country Strategy for Bolivia: Improve equity and efficiency in basic service provision. The Strategy specifically mentions the need to ensure the capacity to operate and maintain the works. This will be an important aspect of the Program's design.

OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the operation is to increase the coverage of services for potable water supply and safe disposal of wastewater increased for rural communities in a way that ensures their sustainability.

EXPECTED RESULTS

It is anticipated that a minimum of 200,000 rural inhabitants will have formal potable water and wastewater disposal services for the first time. Due to the community involvement resulting from the second component, the services will be sustainable in technical and financial terms. The Deputy Ministry of Basic Services will have a greater capacity to support the development and operation of rural water and sanitation projects in the future.

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
