

# Definition of Non-Covered Prescription Drug Services



## National Plan

The Prescription Drug Plan does not pay for:

- » Experimental drugs or substances not approved by the relevant national authorities where your treatment occurs (e.g., the Food and Drugs Administration, FDA, in the case of the U.S.).
- » Drugs labeled, “Caution – Limited by National / Federal Law to Investigational Use”.
- » Over-the-counter drugs.
- » Prescription vitamins, except prenatal vitamins, certain vitamins that are part of cancer treatment or other treatments of other critical medical conditions, and vitamins in large dosages associated with major deficiencies of said vitamins.
- » Herbal or food/nutritional supplements.
- » Medicinal foods or medical vitamins available over the counter.
- » Any medicinal product which does not contain chemical ingredients. Pill/supplements, whose composition is made of natural ingredients, will not be covered regardless of how it is labeled in different countries.
- » Homeopathic products, pill and medicines.
- » Chinese medicine.
- » Cosmetic prescriptions.
- » Phytotherapy.
- » Hair growth stimulants, hair tonics, and special shampoos.
- » Special toothpastes.
