## BANKS COUNTRY STRATEGY

The Bank's country strategy have as main elements: i) increase the economy's productivity and competitiveness; ii) improve the efficiency of the social policies; and iii) promote modern, decentralized, and efficient government services. The Program will target the first two elements since it contributes to a greater access to export markets increasing the value of the agricultural sector. This intervention has been envisaged in the "National Competitiveness and Compensation Program for Peruvian Agriculture 2005-2010", that has been prepared due to the FTA negotiation with the USA. The Program will also support the third element, through strengthening of the Regional Governments that will start adopting their their new remits. I

## OBJECTIVES

The program's objective is to contribute to farmer's competitiveness by preventing, and eradicating diseases that affect cattle, hogs, and camelids; extending the fruit fly eradication program; and by introducing food safety services, and agricultural health services for seeds and organic production.

## EXPECTED RESULTS

The expected results are: i) prevent the entry of bovine brucellosis, foot-and-mouth disease, and swine fever and avoid their dissemination within the country; ii) increase access to export markets for those domestic regions that have been certified as free from bovine brucellosis, foot-and-mouth disease, and swine fever; iii) increase exports and domestic production for those products sensible to the fruit fly; iv) improve public health guaranteeing the food safety standards for bovine and pork based foods in the main domestic markets; v) increase the exports of organic production; and v) increase the productivity due to an increased use of certified seed.
