II. Objective and Justification

- 2.1 The objective of this technical cooperation (TC) is to provide technical support to National Offices of Statistics and line ministries to expand the efforts to collect data on gender and diversity supported by international best-practices. This work will be a cross-department collaboration (with other divisions such as ICS/IFD, CTI/IFD, CMF/IFD, RND/CSD, EDU/SCL, SPH/SCL, and others) that in their technical work are often participating in dialogue with government agencies in charge of strategic efforts of nationally representative data collection (population census, household surveys, agricultural census, enterprise surveys, education and health administrative data, and others). This TC will support the current and future portfolio of operations by fostering the availability of disaggregated data available in the region with is fundamental to increase the quality of gender and diversity (G&D) mainstreaming. Additionally, this team will produce technical resources for team leaders to support project implementation units in the generation of disaggregated project data.
- 2.2 While there has been progress in recent years, reliable data in the region on gender and especially on diversity lags. This is the case at all levels: national censuses, surveys, administrative data, and project monitoring indicators. This lack of data makes it more challenging for countries to implement cohesive gender and diversity policies. Furthermore, it has limited the ability of the IDB to address issues of gender, diversity, or the intersectionality between the two in a larger set of projects. At least two causes can explain this problem. First, countries often lack technical support on

best-practices to collect this type of data in a manner that allows for in-country and regional comparisons. Second, at the survey level, producing statistically representative figures on certain population groups is costly because it may require revising sampling frameworks and increasing sample sizes. This TC is aligned with Vision 2025 (AB-3266), which underscores the importance of strengthening G&D mainstreaming and the development of a business line of investments that specifically contributes to these issues. It is also consistent with the IDBG Second Update to the Institutional Strategy (UIS, AB-3190-2) goal of social inclusion and equality and its institutional cross-cutting theme of gender and diversity. Additionally, it responds to the Supplemental Document to the IDBG's response to the Barranquilla Resolution titlanalyzing the IDB Group Work to Address Gender and Diversity Equity, which identifies the need to expand the IDB's technical expertise and financial resources dedicated to the production of disaggregated data. The countries that this TC will support will be selected according to the need of technical and financial support of National Offices of Statistics and line ministries prioritizing those countries that have the biggest opportunities of improvement in the disaggregation of G&D data.

III. Description of Activities and Outputs

- 3.1 **Component I: Technical assistance.** This component will finance individual consultancies to provide direct technical assistance to National Offices of Statistics and line ministries interested in improving its data collection (census and surveys in the case of the former and administrative data in the case of the latter) in aspects related to gender and diversity disaggregation. Expected results: increased number of countries with disaggregated data on gender and diversity in census, surveys or administrative data.
- 3.2 **Component II: Analytical work.** This component will finance the production, publication, translation, and dissemination of analytical work aimed at sharing best practices and knowledge on gender and diversity data collection. Expected results: publications downloaded by country specialists in the region.
