## TERMS OF REFERENCE

### Disaster Risk Reduction Best Practices for Climate Resilient Coastal Area Development

#### RG-T2950

### I. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The countries of the Caribbean include small island developing states (SIDS) and mainland territories that collectively constitute the second most hazard-prone region in the world, typically experiencing disaster losses amounting to US\$3 billion annually. A significant proportion of these losses are incurred within coastal areas, where disaster risk is concentrated in densely populated coastal towns and communities. These areas typically are low lying, prone to various natural and technological hazards including extreme weather systems, earthquakes, the effects of volcanic eruptions, floods, landslides and oil spills; have characteristic unplanned, unregulated development and/or a concentration of economic activity.
- 1.2 Global climate change is predicted to increase disaster risk in the Caribbean by increasing the frequency and severity of hurricanes, tropical storms, floods, storm surge, coastal erosion and generating new hazards such as sea level rise; that will have debilitating effects on coastal ecosystems, directly impact on key economic activities that depend on coastal resources such as tourism, fisheries, agriculture and water resource management, and increase socioeconomic vulnerability. These scenarios demonstrate the need for the planning and implementation of appropriate adaptation measures in order to cope with climate change impacts and protect the physical, environmental and economic viability of coastal zone.
- 1.3 A significant proportion of the losses that accrue to climate change can be averted through comprehensive disaster risk management (DRM). For example, it is estimated that up to 45% of the losses that accrue to climate change in the Caribbean can be averted through prevention and mitigation measures<sup>1</sup>. Urgent and coordinated action to incorporate risk management solutions, including those associated with climate change, into coastal area development in the Caribbean is a critical adaptation strategy.
- 1.4 The promotion or facilitation of adaptation measures in the context of disaster risk reduction (DRR) has gained increasing importance in international political discourse over the last five years. In 2005 the Hyogo Framework for Action identified the need to “promote the integration of risk reduction associated with present climate variability and future climate change into strategies for the reduction of disaster risk and adaptation to climate change”. In 2007 the 13<sup>th</sup> COP,

- Bali – Action Plan called for the first time, consideration of “risk management and risk reduction strategies, including risk sharing and transfer mechanisms, such as insurance”. The same AP also highlights the needs to enhancing action on adaptation, including “disaster reduction strategies and means to address loss and damage associated with climate change impacts in developing countries”. More recently, in 2009, the IPCC/ISDR commissioned a two-year study on “Managing Climate Extremes and Disasters to Advance Climate Change Adaptation”.
- 1.5 These international policy mandates and discourse continue to highlight that many of the issues of concern to climate change adaptation (CCA) are clearly related to disaster risk reduction (DRR) and demand a close and individual consideration when seen from a disaster risk management (DRM) perspective. Thus, there is a need to examine how the CCA, DRM, and development planning nexus is and could be applied for building climate resilience for sustainable development.
  - 1.6 At a regional level, the regional strategies for disaster risk management and for climate change in the Caribbean viz. the Enhanced Comprehensive Disaster Management (CDM) Strategy and the Regional Strategy for Development Resilient to Climate Change, endorsed by the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) in 2008 and 2009 respectively, recognize that (i) both DRR and CCA are rooted in development practice, and (ii) the need to address total climate risk i.e. impacts of changing CC averages and climate variability, in an integrated, holistic climate risk management framework, and in this context of the need for an integrated approach to DRR and CCA for sustainable development.
  - 1.7 Within the context of CDM, a plethora of well-established DRR best practices have been implemented at the regional, national, sectoral and community levels in the Caribbean, at the levels of policy and practice. In the case of CCA, a relatively young and emerging field, the primary focus to date has been on the generation of CC strategy, research, data, and theories to support the identification of climate change vulnerabilities. Practical applications of CCA are less common though increasing.
  - 1.8 Notwithstanding that the regional strategic frameworks for DRR and CC articulate the need for the integration of DRR and CCA for sustainable development, its practical application in general and in coastal zone management in particular at the national, sectoral and local levels is at an incipient stage. Coastal zone managers in the Caribbean are currently faced with the challenge of improving their knowledge and understanding of climate related disaster risk as well as on the techniques and tools by which that knowledge could be applied to routine decision-making in the coastal zone. More specifically there is a need to identify and incorporate the risk associated with climate variability and change into the design and implementation of disaster risk reduction policy, institutional frameworks, laws and regulations, and programs related to the coastal zone as a key strategy for adaptation. An important issue to be addressed relates to the disconnect that

currently exists between the DRM, CCA and CZM and development planning communities that appears to be hampering seamless integration.

- 1.9 Against the background of increasing coastal vulnerability, and in order to assist countries to improve climate resilience in the coastal zone, the Sustainable Energy, Climate Change and Disaster Risk Management Network of the IDB will host a sub-Regional Policy Dialogue on Disaster Risk Reduction Best Practices for Climate Resilient Coastal Area Development in Barbados, in February 2010. The dialogue will bring together policy makers and technical specialists in coastal zone management, climate change adaptation, disaster risk reduction and development planning.
- 1.10 These terms of reference refer to the services of an individual consultant to prepare a technical study on DRR best practices that could support CCA in the coastal zone of the Caribbean and that will inform the sub-Regional Policy Dialogue.

## **II. OBJECTIVE**

- 2.1 The objective of the consultancy is to prepare a technical study on disaster risk reduction best practices that could be used to improve climate change adaptation in coastal areas in the Caribbean; and to deliver its results at a sub-Regional Policy Dialogue to be hosted by the Bank's Sustainable Energy, Climate Change and Disaster Risk Management Network in May 2017.

## **III. ACTIVITIES**

- 3.1 The consultant will conduct the following activities:

### **Technical Study**

- (i) The technical study will be conducted in the Caribbean and will focus on IDB member countries in the Caribbean (Barbados, Bahamas, Belize, Dominican Republic, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago), though practices in the wider Caribbean will be included. It shall include but not be limited to the following:
  - (a) A review of the physical, economic, social and environmental impacts of climate change on (i) disaster risk management and (ii) coastal zone management in SIDS in the Caribbean; documenting existing and predicted impacts of various coastal hazards (hurricane and tropical storms and associated wind and storm surge hazard; coastal erosion, inland flooding, landslides, drought, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, sea level rise);
  - (b) An assessment of the extent to which DRM and CCA are incorporated in CZM policy and practice in the Caribbean countries, separately and integrally, and directly and indirectly. The assessment should provide specific examples in specific countries, document the main challenges, and identify opportunities for integrating DRR and CCA in ICZM;

- (c) A detailed comprehensive inventory of DRM best practices that are currently being implemented in the countries in the context of CDM, that coastal zone managers in the region may use, in their existing form or enhanced, to address the core challenges of CZM in the context of climate change adaptation. These challenges include issues of coastal flooding, inland flooding, coastal erosion, cliff instability/ landslides, salt water intrusion, loss of wetlands, beach loss and public access. The inventory should include detailed descriptions of tools and instruments at the level of policy and practice in the areas of (i) risk identification; (ii) prevention and mitigation; (iii) financial protection and risk transfer; (iv) preparedness and response (such as EWS, community based systems); (v) rehabilitation and reconstruction; and (vi) monitoring of risk management performance. The inventory should document national, sectoral and community level practices. Regional best practices should be included in the context of their applicability at the national level. Where the identified DRR practices need to be enhanced for CCA, the consultant should indicate what steps are required (e.g. setback determination, infrastructure design, sustainable land use planning), with appropriate responsibility;
  - (d) A similar inventory of other DRR best practices that are applicable to the Caribbean but not currently applied by coastal zone managers in the Caribbean, for example from other SIDS e.g. Pacific region;
  - (e) On the basis of (a) to (d) above, make recommendations for appropriate actions to be taken by policy makers and technicians in coastal zone management, DRM, CCA and development planning that would facilitate and improve the efficient mainstreaming of DRR and CCA in ICZM and the increased use of DRR best practices in support of risk-based decision-making in coastal zone management. These may include identification of needs (e.g. use of decision support tools, cooperation, financing, monitoring) and improvements in policy, institutional legal and regulatory frameworks, and action at the national, sectoral and community levels. This should include a checklist for integrating DRR and CCA in CZM for use by coastal zone managers, disaster risk managers and climate change adaptation specialists and/or a review of an existing ICZM plan for an IDB member country in the Caribbean indicating specifically where this may be achieved. document challenges for implementation of a ICZM mandate that incorporates DRR and CCA;
  - (f) On the basis of the results obtained, make recommendations for future Bank technical assistance and investment.
- (ii) As part of the consultancy, the consultant shall undertake a field visit to the Region after receipt of IDB comments on the first draft of the technical study in order to obtain additional information including discussion with

stakeholders as needed. The consultant shall include a proposal for the criteria for selection of the specific country/countries to be visited in the inception report.

#### **Resource Person at RND Retreat**

- (ii) Prepare a 30-minute PowerPoint presentation (with detailed notes for delivery) summarizing the results of the technical study; and deliver the presentation at a sub-RPD to be held in Barbados in May 2017. The consultant will also function as a resource person at the sub-RPD.

### **IV. REPORTS AND DELIVERABLES**

4.1 The consultant shall submit the following deliverables:

- An inception report which includes an outline of the technical study, a description of the methodology; and work program within one week of the start of the consultancy (20<sup>th</sup> May). The inception study shall identify a proposal for a field visit to the region in order to obtain additional information as needed.
- A first draft technical study, as described in paragraph 3.1, within six weeks of the start of the consultancy (24<sup>th</sup> July). The IDB shall submit comments on the first draft within 10 days of receipt of the first draft (3<sup>rd</sup> June).
- A revised draft technical study and draft PowerPoint Presentation, which incorporates IDB's comments within 10 weeks of the start of the consultancy (21<sup>st</sup> August).
- A final technical study and PowerPoint presentation incorporating the comments of the Regional Policy Dialogue, within two weeks after the Dialogue, which will take place in Barbados at a date to be determined in mid 2017.

All documents submitted will be presented in English.
